Program Details

The Master of Management in Manufacturing Management will prepare graduates for leadership positions within manufacturing and automotive industries.

Students will study and live in Canada for approximately one year while enrolled in 12 courses. Students take common core Master of Management courses, as well as courses in Manufacturing Management.

Students who require additional English language training must complete a seven week English-language training program and orientation to Canada. Students who demonstrate excellent English language skills will be exempted from this training program.

Admission Requirements

- Bachelor-level degree in an acceptable discipline from an academic institution approved by the University of Windsor
- The equivalent of a B average (75%) or higher in undergraduate studies (when converted to Canadian Standards)
- TOEFL-PBT score of at least 560 (or equivalent)
- A successful interview with a representative from the University of Windsor
- Two letters of reference

Enrollment is limited. Preference will be given to candidates who exceed the above minimum requirements and those who have relevant work experience. Please visit our web site for the application deadline.
