## PROGRAM PROFILE

### Three-year Bachelor of Arts degree in Anthropology (30 courses)

The three-year, 30-course degree program provides a basic understanding of the important issues debated in Anthropology. Core anthropology courses in archaeology, culture, and social justice are combined with a wide range of courses from other disciplines, including Sociology, Criminology, and Family Studies.

### Four-Year Bachelor of Arts Degree in Anthropology (40 courses)

The four-year, 40-course degree program provides greater depth in the conceptual approaches to cultural diversity and international development. Fourth-year courses offer training in anthropological methods and theory and emphasize small group discussions, presentations, and research projects.

### Combined Bachelor of Arts Degree in Anthropology (40 courses)

This four-year, 40-course degree offers you the opportunity to combine training in Anthropology with another discipline, in order to provide depth in two areas. Students have typically combined Anthropology with History, Communication Studies, English and Criminology.

### Admission Requirements

Ontario Secondary School Graduates require six Grade 12 U or U/C courses, including Grade 12 U English 1.
